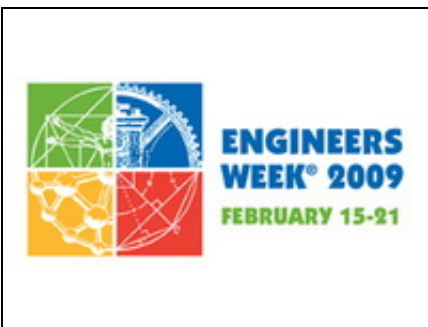
Mechanical, Aerospace & Structural Engineering Professor Wins James B. Eads Award
